

Broadband Equity, Access, And Deployment (BEAD) Program Overview

BEAD provides funding to eligible entities and territories for broadband planning, deployment, mapping, and adoption activities, with the primary purpose of expanding high-speed internet access.

Eligible Activities

- Deploy broadband service to unserved locations and underserved locations
- Ensure deployment of gigabit connections to community anchor institutions (e.g., schools, hospitals, libraries)
- Remaining funds can support access, adoption, and equity-related uses

BEAD Challenge Process Overview

During the BEAD Challenge Process, the State Broadband Program Office will only allow challenges from **nonprofit organizations, units of local and tribal governments, and broadband service providers**. While NTIA guidelines state that residents cannot submit challenges directly, they are encouraged to work with local governments and non-profits to provide speed test data to support challenges.

Description and objectives

The Challenge Process allows a unit of local government, nonprofit organization, or broadband service provider to challenge a determination made by the State in the Initial Proposal as to whether a particular location or CAI is eligible for BEAD funds, including whether a particular location is unserved or underserved.

This process aims to ensure that locations outlined in the Initial Proposal represent an accurate and comprehensive list of the broadband needs across the State.


Allowable Challenges

- ✓ Availability: Broadband service not offered at location
- Technical features (e.g., speed, data cap, and latency): Service falls outside established thresholds
- ✓ **Technology type:** Listed technology for location is incorrect
- Business service only: Location is residential, but only business service is offered
- ✓ CAI eligibility determinations: Location should be classified as CAI
- Enforceable commitments: Broadband will be deployed at this location by obligation
- Planned service: Broadband will be deployed at location by June 30, 2024

Unallowable challenges

- ★ Altering the BSL "Building Type" classification
- × Addition of BSLs
- * Removal of BSLs
